

University of Dundee Scholarship

Community Scholarships 2024/5 (the "Scholarships")

Key Facts Document

This Key Facts Document sets out the main details of the Scholarships, as at date of publication. This document should be reviewed alongside the <u>University of Dundee Scholarship Terms and Conditions</u>, as those terms and conditions will provide you with additional information that apply to you in respect of the Scholarships.

Date of publication	February 2024, applicable to 2024/5 academic year (September 2024 or January 2025 entry)
Application Process	Automatic award
	There is no separate application form for this Scholarship, for any region.
	2. The Scholarships are applicable to the following regions:
	 Undergraduate and Postgraduate: Africa South Asia
	3. The University of Dundee Admissions Team will use information from an individual's Course Application to determine if they meet the eligibility criteria.
	The verification process takes place at the initial Offer stage, where the applicant provides evidence that their current domicile (also known as area of permanent residence on your course application) is within one of the above regions or countries.
Who is eligible?	All applicants must:
	Be domiciled and/or permanently resident, as at the date of their Course Application, in an African or South Asian country.
	2. Be awarded one of the following scholarships:
	Vice-Chancellor's Africa
	 Vice-Chancellor's South Asia Global Excellence Scholarship
	3. Hold an offer to study an eligible Undergraduate or Postgraduate Taught course at the University of Dundee:
	 Undergraduate - Must hold an offer for a full time, on campus course - this excludes any course in the School of Medicine or Dentistry. Note: The course must be 120 credits per year.



	 Postgraduate taught - Must hold an offer for a full time, on campus course in any academic school. Note: the course must be 180 credits, apart from PGDip in Professional Legal Practice which is covered by the Scholarship. Master of Research (MRes) and Masters by Research Courses are covered by
	this scholarship.
	4. Be classified as an International Fee-paying student by the University of Dundee.
	5. Not be studying a PhD Course.
	6. Have a Course tuition fee of at least £20,600. Any course which does not have a fee of this value, or above, will not be considered for this award.
	7. Current ICD students who enrolled in ICD in academic year 23/24, will be eligible if they meet the eligibility criteria (provided they enrol with UoD in academic year 24/25). However, ICD applicants who enrol with ICD in academic year 24/25 will not be eligible.
Scholarship Information	The value of this scholarship is £2,500 and is a one-off tuition fee waiver applied to the <u>first year of study</u> only.
	2. All scholarships are paid as a tuition fee waiver. No direct payment is made to any applicant.
	3. The scholarship is paid in the first year of applicable study only.
	4. Scholarships are awarded on an Unconditional basis. However, this is not linked to the Course application status.
	5. Scholarships cannot be awarded on a pro-rata basis.
Key Information	The following information should be read alongside the Vice-Chancellor's Key Facts and Global Excellence Scholarship Key Facts documents.
	 This scholarship is applicable in the entry year to the University of Dundee only (September 2024 or January 2025 intake) and cannot be backdated to previous years.
	2. Applicants are unable to combine the Community Scholarship with:
	 a. Any other University of Dundee scholarship, except for the Vice-Chancellor's Africa Scholarship, the Vice-Chancellor's South Asia Scholarship, and the Global Excellence Scholarship.
	b. If the applicant holds another source of external funding via an external



scholarship, and the value of that external scholarship is lower than the Community Scholarship, then the applicant must decide which scholarship to accept and which to reject. International students cannot hold two sources of funding. In cases where the Community Scholarship is rejected, the University of Dundee will not provide any scholarship funding to the applicant via the Community Scholarship fund.

- c. If the applicant holds a fully-funded external scholarship, the Community Scholarship will be removed as all tuition fees will be covered by the external scholarship.
- d. The University of Dundee will not provide the Community Scholarship as an additional award, except as set out in point 2a. above.
- 3. Should an applicant wish to defer their entry to the University of Dundee, the following rules apply:
 - a. Deferral within the same academic year: Scholarship can also be deferred.
 - b. Deferral to a <u>new</u> academic year: Scholarship <u>cannot</u> be deferred.
- 4. Clearing applicants are eligible to receive this scholarship, and eligibility will be assessed as above.
- 5. Changes to the course of study:
 - a. If an applicant changes Course before, during or after matriculation, the University of Dundee reserves the right to re-assess eligibility for scholarships and may retract the Scholarship Offer should an applicant's eligibility have changed.
 - b. If an applicant changes Fee status or any other personal information before, during or after matriculation, the University of Dundee reserves the right to re-assess eligibility for scholarships and may retract the Scholarship Offer should an applicant's eligibility have changed.
- 6. If an applicant has paid their tuition fees in full prior to being awarded the Community Scholarship, the value of the scholarship will be refunded to the applicant after they have enrolled at the University of Dundee.
 - a. Alternatively, this can be transferred to the University of Dundee accommodation account balance (if applicable).
- 7. The scholarship is only awarded to applicants in the first year of study only.
- 8. All communication with the student will be via email, to their @dundee.ac.uk email address. We may also communicate with other email addresses provided to us by the applicant. Types of communication may be:



- a. Confirming the scholarship.
- b. Informing the applicant that they have not met the criteria to be awarded the scholarship.
- c. Requesting further information.
- 9. The University of Dundee is unable to disclose details of the scholarship to anyone other than the applicant unless consent is given by the applicant to do so.
- 10. Should a student withdraw from their programme of study, the University of Dundee Fees department may be in contact regarding payment of fees and scholarship balance.
- 11. All scholarship decisions are final and cannot be appealed.
